Winery Background

Dr. Konstantin Frank ignited the “Vinifera Revolution”, a movement that forever changed the course of wine growing in the Finger Lakes and the United States. Dr. Frank’s vision, knowledge and determination are credited with elevating the New York wine industry from a state of happy mediocrity to a level that today commands world attention. Located on Keuka lake in the Finger Lakes region, Dr. Konstantin Frank Wines features some of the oldest vinifera vines in the United States and continues to produce wines of distinction and quality.

Vinification

Made in the saignée method. A method of rosé production that involves bleeding off the juice after limited contact with the skins. Pronounced ‘sonyay’. After this process, this juice consisting of Pinot Noir goes through a cold fermentation in stainless steel tanks.

The Wine

Description: A delicate rosé with subtle notes of strawberry, rose petals, pomegranate and citrus.

Style:	Dry with crisp mouth feel.
Body:	Light bodied
Vintage Influence:	The subtle floral notes are in harmony with delicate fruit flavors.
Cellaring:	Drink now or cellar until 2018
Food Pairing:	Pancetta, grilled white fish, summer salads
Analysis:	Alcohol: 12.8%, Acidity: 0.60 g/100mL, pH: 3.50, Sugar: 0.54%
