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DISCOVER... Grüner Veltliner

What it is...

One of Austria's flagship grape varieties. Grüner Veltliner (German word pronounced 'groona feltleena') accounts for one third of Austria's vineyards.

Facts about Grüner Veltliner:

- A **delicate** grape that only grows in cool climates
- Ripens later than Riesling
- **Less acidic** than Riesling
- Produces elegant, dry, light to medium bodied wines
- Rarely sees oak
- A favorite of the On-Trade for being a very **food-friendly** wine
- Typical notes include: white pepper, pear, herbal notes with rounded mouth feel

At Dr. Frank...

Grüner Veltliner fits perfectly within the Dr. Frank family of alternative varieties with its nose of floral, melon and honeysuckle. It is **dry** on the palate with subtle herbal and white pepper notes. A **light** wine with a **soft mouth feel** for those looking for a more **subtle** food friendly wine that pairs well with delicate-flavored foods such as scallops and roasted vegetables.

Analysis: Alcohol: 12.5%, Acidity: .58g/100mL, pH: 3.14, Residual Sugar: <0.5%
